Sticky knowledge about our local area

- The River Avon (Shakespeare's Avon)
 begins in Northamptonshire and flows
 through the towns of Rugby, Warwick,
 Stratford-upon-Avon, Evesham, Pershore
 and Tewkesbury where it joins the river
 Severn
- The Avon in Warwickshire stretches for 85 miles
- Shipston-on-Stour was historically used as a stopping place for stagecoaches and as a sheep-washing market town
- It's name was originally in old English: 'Sheep-wash-town'!
- Farmers would come to the wash their sheep before selling the animal or its wool to make money
- Shipston developed many wool-based skills, including making tapestries.
- The nearby hamlet of Barcheston created the Sheldon Tapestries and was the first manufacturing home in England for the weaving of tapestries in the Tudor period
- As the demand for wool fell, in 1836 a horse-drawn tramway line was established between Stratford-upon-Avon and Moreton-in-Marsh
- Steam trains began to use this line in 1889 for passengers until 1929 and final closure of the line in 1960
