


Sticky knowledge about landscape art

- Objects appear smaller the further away you are from them. Parallel lines eventually meet towards an object in the distance - called the vanishing point
- The point where two lines meet at a vanishing point is called the horizon line
- Construction lines can be used to make sure objects remain in perspective - this is called linear perspective
- Atmospheric perspective is when the atmosphere has an effect on the objects the further you are away from them to give an impression of depth and distance
- Aerial perspective is when background objects becomes paler and less defined as if seen from the air
- Abstract art is art that doesn't give an accurate impression of the objects

Sticky Skills!

- Using materials such as bubble wrap, masking tape, cotton wool to area effects in watercolour landscapes
- Using water carefully to affect the consistency of watercolour paints
- Be selective over how collage materials are manipulated for effects on the artwork
