## History: Shipston Wool Fair - local history

### Lesson 5

To know some of the different things wool was used for at the time of the Wool Fair

- I can describe clothes worn in the past
- I can explain how wool was used to create things in the home
- I can compare past and present textiles used for clothing and homes



### Lesson 3

To know how wool was transported and sold

- I can explain how wool was transported by stagecoach in the 1800's
- I can describe where and how the wool was sold
- I can explain how transporting and selling goods has changed over the centuries

To know how wool was made before modern technology

- I can describe how sheep were sheared and wool was spun and carded in the past
- I can name and describe technology from the past
- I can explain how technology has changed and compare past and present machinery
