Review of spending 2023/24

How has your school's spending improved PE attainment?

PE attainment has improved by providing all children with the same opportunities. Working with the MAT school has allowed us to tailor our sporting opportunities according to the facilities in the area, the interests of the children and the diversity of need. Our children go to sporting events feeling they can achieve under their own merit.

How has your school spending increased pupil PE and sport activity levels?

We are now an OPAL school and are working towards the accreditation. OPAL has had a measure impact on the physical activity of all the children at break and lunchtimes. All children get involved with a variety of activities every break time.

How is your school going to ensure that the improvement made through its spending of the PE and sports premium are sustainable?

Development of a wider variety of after school clubs that are accessible for all children, particularly vulnerable children. Continue to expand the after school inter sports through the MAT. Increase opportunities for external sporting providers to come into school lead coaching sessions.
