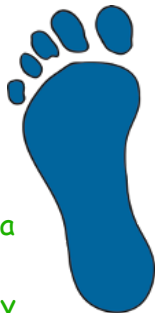

# Steps through Learning

## French: In a French classroom

### Lesson 5

To know how to prepare and present a short speech



I can include vocabulary learned in a speech

I can speak clearly and confidently

### Lesson 4

To know how to read and understand short sentences

I can create a sentence of my own from an example

### Lesson 3

To know how to ask and answer questions



I can ask a question about having an item

I can answer questions about having an item

### Lesson 2

To know school bag objects



I can spot if a noun is masculine or feminine

I can compose a sentence to tell someone about an object

### Lesson 1

To know how to respond to simple classroom instructions



I can give instructions in the classroom

I can understand familiar classroom phrases
