Parents Information evening

We will be holding our annual information evening for parents, to let you know all about our expectations for the year. Information will be available about homework, clubs, routines and schedules.

Parents with children at Tredington are invited to attend on Tuesday 16th September at 7pm and Newbold will be on Thursday 18th September. The evening at Newbold will be split into two slots. Reception parents at 7pm and Year 1 parents at 7.30pm.

WOW day

On Wednesday, everyone at Tredington arrived at school to discover that an anonymous note had appeared saying that the toasters and money had been stolen. Concerned and upset, we decided to carry out some detective work to find the suspect. We took fingerprints and a handwriting sample from everyone, interviewed witnesses and took a mould of one of the footprints we found in the sand pit. Our detective work lead us to find the money and toasters (taken by Mrs Baker!) and we all earned a piece of free toast for our hard work! Luckily, Mrs Baker didn't really steal the money and it was a very exciting start to our new 'Mission Impossible' theme.



Spelling

In our recent Ofsted inspection, spelling was identified as an area to develop. We have developed an exciting new approach to how we teach vocabulary. Children will learn a sound or spelling pattern and investigate this during the week by identifying similar words in the books they read and adding them to a display for others to use. Instead of a weekly spelling test, teachers will check children's ability to apply the pattern to spell words in a variety of ways. Five words which follow the rule will be sent home and children will be asked to find other words which follow the pattern. As children move higher up the school, they will develop an ability to spot exceptions to the rule and sense whether a spelling 'looks' correct. This approach will develop good spelling in children's writing across the curriculum.

Attendance Reminder

As you will all be aware, current attendance regulations stipulate a Head teacher may not grant a leave of absence during term-time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits. It is for the Head teacher to decide what he/she views as 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. If the leave is granted, the Head teacher is able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s).

Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued and not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996.

Parents are asked to respect the new regulations under which the school must work and if there is a need to take a child out of school during term-time, an application or request must be made in advance and make clear how the circumstances are exceptional.
