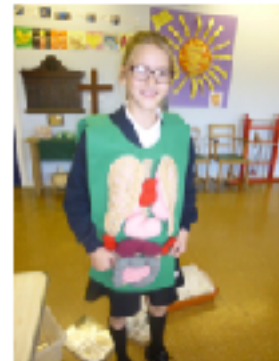
Sapphire Class Update:

All 3 & 4 year olds are entitled to the 15 hours Universal Entitlement the term following their third birthday. You may also be entitled to the additional 15 free hours giving you a total of 30 free hours care a week over 38 weeks.
