#### **Amber Class Update**

Amber class have hit the ground running for the last term of this year. We have been busy exploring

our new topic of 'Eco warriors' where we will be looking at rainforests, eco systems, Mayan civilisations amongst other things! Inline with this, in science we will be looking at evolution and adaptation of living things and we have started by examining the meaning of evolution and inheritance. We also had fun exploring how the human body has evolved by examining the shapes and features of each others' skulls to see how they have changed! For geography, we made the most of the lovely few days of weather by consolidating our knowledge of longitude and latitude to create large maps of the Earth on the



playground and plotting on countries according to their longitude and latitudes co-ordinates.

Finally, we have been working extremely hard in preparation for the upcoming SATs assessments in a few weeks - working on practising our arithmetic skills, mathematical reasoning, spelling, grammar and understanding lots of texts through reading. I am sure Amber class will continue to work hard throughout the rest of the term.

# **Emerald Class Update**



Our new theme, 'Crotchets and Quavers,' is about music and how we hear. To start the topic, we listened to a piece of music and created our own interpretation in the style of the artist Kandinsky. We decided which lines, shapes, symbols and colours to use. 'Wonderstruck' is our new class text which tells the stories of two children and how they are intertwined; both children are deaf and on an adventure. To better understand how this might affect their lives, we have found out how our ears work and how we could adapt our school to support someone who is deaf.



### **Wild Learning**



Children in Amber and Emerald class are looking at 'The Tunnel' By Anthony Browne in Wild Learning. They have created tunnels, artwork that reflects the personalities of the

characters and mud faces on trees. Sapphire class are getting to grips with knots so we can start to build shelters which in some of our last lessons is vital as the weather has been against us!

# Sapphire Class Update

#### Changes to Data Protection Law

You may be aware that from May 2018, the rules around data protection are changing. The 'General Data Protection Regulation' (GDPR) will change how we can use your personal data and keep it safe, and will also strengthen your rights over your own data.

The point of this is to make sure sensitive or private information about yourselves and your children stays safe. Whilst it is similar to the current Data Protection Act in many ways, there are a few differences, so we need to make a few changes at the school in order to ensure we remain compliant.

In the next week or so you will receive a pack which includes updated Data Collection Forms, Photo Consent etc. It is vitally important that you complete and fully sign the forms and return to school as soon as possible.

Once the forms are complete and returned you will not be asked to do them again annually. I thank you in advance, for your co-operation as without your permissions we will not be able to send newsletters via email, include your children in photographs on the Facebook page etc.

#### **Running Club**

Hello everyone! Just a small Running club update for everyone. Firstly, let me say a huge congratulations to everyone who took part in the Schools Cross Country on Wednesday 25th April; you all ran some fantastic races and really did our school proud!

Runners in the Running Club have been working hard for all of this year so far and have made some excellent progress. We have been looking at how to adjust our running technique so that we become more efficient runners - for both long and short distances. As well as this, we have enjoyed developing our abilities to run at speed and improve our stamina through lots of 'fartlek' style training by playing lots of games!

We also have had successes at the inter-school cross country races on four Saturdays throughout this year with children competing against lots of other children from around other local schools. All of the children from Newbold and Tredington did their best in every race and showed a real enthusiasm and determination to improve. All you need to do is register for free on the ParkRun website to claim your barcode that will allow you to run the course and get a time.
