

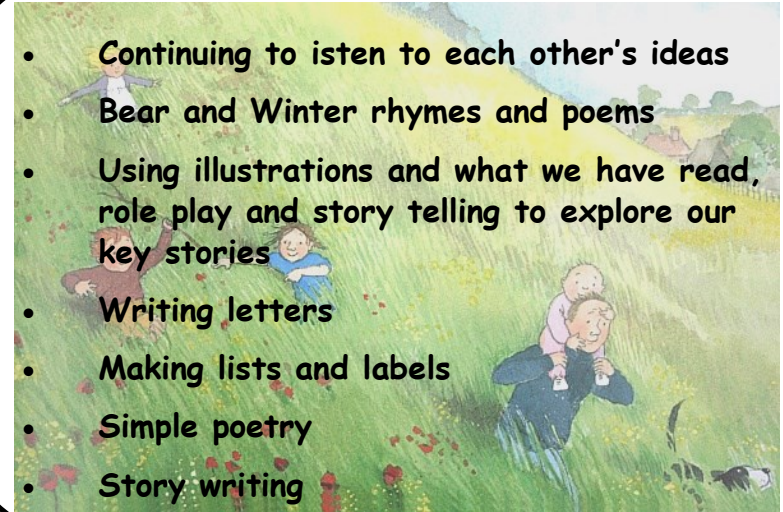
Topic

- Learning bear songs and talking about music through PE and RE



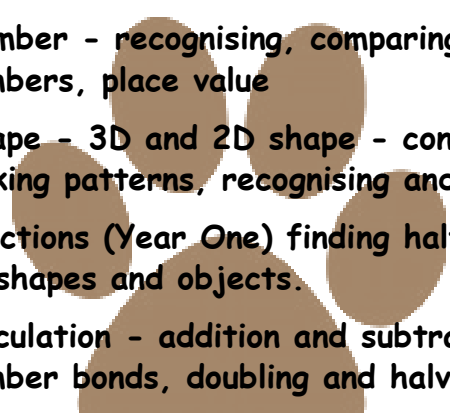
Language & Literacy
