

As Writers, we will:

- Write character and setting descriptions based on traditional Greek and Roman myths
- Create non-chronological reports about the rivalry between Athens and Sparta; the British Roman city of Colchester
- Compose instructions on how to make traditional Greek/Roman food
- Be newspaper reporters at the scene of the downfall of Julius Caesar
- Study features of free verse poetry
- Retell Greek/Roman myths from memory
- Write persuasive advertisements

As Scientists, we will:

- Describe the simple functions of the human digestive system
- Identify the different types of teeth in humans and their functions
- Identify the main parts of the human circulatory system, describing the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood.
- Recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way our bodies function
- Describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported in humans
- Find out what happens inside our bodies when we get ill

As Geographers, we will:

- Study a romanised region of Britain
- Use fieldwork to observe, measure and record
- Find out how volcanoes erupt, looking specifically at the great eruption of Mount Vesuvius

As Mathematicians, we will:

- Use Roman Numerals, comparing the number system to our own
- count, order, compare and round using place value
- Calculate mentally and using formal written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Improve the speed and accuracy of times table recall, including related division facts
- Create, read and interpret data, recognising the difference between discrete and continuous
- Find equivalent fractions
- Compare and order fractions
- Add and subtract fractions

In RE, we will:

- Compare Christian and Muslim beliefs in God
- Consider how following God can bring freedom and justice.

In Computing, we will:

- Collect and present data using spreadsheet software
- Create algorithms to programme a character through an increasingly complex maze
- Test and debug algorithms

As Historians, we will:

- Compare modern day life to that of Ancient Greece and Rome
- Discover all about the origins of democracy
- Study the bitter rivalry between Athens and Sparta
- Learn about significant Roman cities of Britain
- Find out about Roman Emperors, and the downfall of Julius Caesar
- How the Romans invaded Britain, and the rebellion of Boudicca
